I am pleased to welcome all of you to the 19th Conference and Exhibition on Occupational Safety and Health, themed **“BRIDGING THE OSH GAP THROUGH A PREVENTION CULTURE”**.

We are greatly honoured for the kind presence of the Honourable Deputy Minister this morning to deliver the keynote address and officiate COSH 2016. We deeply appreciate the Deputy Minister's commitment to the promotion of occupational safety and health (OSH) in the country.

As an organisation committed to assist industries, employers and employees to effectively manage and improve OSH standards in their organisations, NIOSH will continue to ensure that COSH themes are relevant and quality speakers are invited for the benefit of OSH fraternity that shares a common goal, which is to achieve a safer and healthier workplace for all.

Every year, senior Government leaders, decision and policy makers, occupational safety and health practitioners, professionals, academicians, employers, as well as representatives from the public and private sectors gather at COSH to share best practices and latest findings as well as exchange of knowledge and ideas.

COSH 2016 is thus the premier forum to help organisations formulate the best solutions and strategies to enhance the safety and health standards as well as address OSH concerns in the current dynamic and challenging landscape.

Although in Malaysia, awareness about OSH has steadily increased over the years, only a strong commitment to an OSH management system will achieve an OSH culture in the organisation.

SOSCO statistics show that the number of industrial accidents had fallen significantly over the past decade. There were 34,272 industrial accidents last year compared with 43,885 cases in 2005.

On the other hand, commuting accidents has been on an upward trend. A total of 28,591 commuting accidents was recorded in 2015, which represents a whopping 65.3 per cent increase from 17,297 cases in 2005.

For the past 10 months, accidents involving children grabbed headlines in the media. These include accidents at schools, water-related recreational areas and while using escalators. The injuries or death of these children could have been avoided if OSH regulations and practices were complied with and observed at those locations.

Majority of workplace accidents and diseases is preventable. Accidents do



not just happen, they can be prevented. Prevention should be part of our culture and embraced by everyone.

Work instructions, safety equipment and technical improvements cannot fully guarantee that OSH objectives are met, especially in preventing work-related accidents and diseases.

What we need is a culture of prevention, which is achieved through life-long education, learning through experience and information dissemination. The principles of prevention should be incorporated in laws, moral studies, customs, behaviours and beliefs.

According to ILO Convention No. 187: Promotional Framework for Occupational Safety and Health Convention, 2006, “a national preventative safety and health culture” is a culture in which the right to safe and healthy working environment is respected at all levels, where government, employers and workers actively participate in securing a safe and healthy working environment through a system of defined rights, responsibilities and duties, and where the principle of prevention is accorded the highest priority.



The prevention culture is also the cornerstone of Malaysia's Occupational Safety and Health Master Plan for 2016-2020 with the theme, "OSH Transformation – Preventive Culture".

The global trend in OSH today is towards a more integrated prevention concept. OSH is now regarded as a social responsibility and countries are required to have a blueprint for building an accident prevention culture with a framework for national and international prevention strategies.

Establishing a safe and healthy work environment requires changes in how the culture of the organisation understands and acts on safety. These changes require leadership capable of transforming not just a physical environment, but also the beliefs and practices of those who create the risk and those who work with the risk.

During the current challenging time characterised by intense global competition, it is not enough for companies to make safety a priority. Priorities change but culture stands the test of time.

Companies must be willing to consistently invest to improve OSH because having a healthy workforce and a safe workplace adds value to the business and increases competitiveness.

Preventive safety and health culture is now more important with the growing concern of work-related stress, attributed to the complex nature of jobs and demands of the contemporary work environment. Stress, if not managed well, could lead to greater psycho-social risks at work and would be very costly to organisation.

In our endeavour to build a culture of prevention, NIOSH has taken an initiative to instil OSH awareness from an early age for school children to prepare them to be more conscious of safety and health when they eventually join the work environment.

In short, to ensure a successful prevention culture, we need to internalise OSH awareness and understanding into business practices at the enterprise level and macro policies at the national level. Within the organisation, it is essential to assimilate good OSH values into the mindsets and behaviours of managers and employees.

Before I conclude allow me once again as NIOSH Chairman to thank distinguished guests, conference speakers, participants and exhibitors including the generous sponsors in making this event a success. My special thanks especially to organising committee members for their efforts and hardwork in making COSH 2016 a reality.

I hope that at the end of COSH 2016, we will come up with better and more innovative ways to develop and foster preventive culture to meet the country's target of achieving zero accident in the workplace.

Allow me to conclude my speech with an inspiring quote from the boxing legend Muhammad Ali, who once said, "If my mind can conceive it, and my heart can believe it – then I can achieve it."

So, ladies and gentlemen, zero accident in the workplace is not an impossible feat if we put our mind and heart to it.

## Riot laments critical shortage of OSH officers

**BANGI:** There is a critical shortage of occupational safety and health (OSH) officers in the country with only 1,000 of them to cater to four million workers, says Human Resource Minister Datuk Seri Richard Riot.

He said the number of workers increased each year but not technical OSH officers.

"The existence of OSH competent officers is important to deal with

OSH challenges," said Riot, adding that among the challenges were changes in technology, increased task complexity, and increased workload of Department of Occupational Safety and Health (DOSH) officers.

"There are only 1,000 officers to cater to four million workers from 173,000 workplaces registered with the department in 2016," Riot said after officiating at the closing cere-

mony of Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme 2016: Occupational Safety and Health Competency Management training here yesterday.

He also said the complexity of the task would increase with oncoming high impact mega projects which included the Mass Rapid Transit (MRT) in the Klang Valley and Pengerang Integrated Petroleum Complex in Johor.

Despite the shortcomings, the ministry is targeting to lower the number of industrial accidents each year.

"In 2015, the number of accidents decreased to 38,753 cases compared to 49,598 industrial cases reported 10 years ago. Analysis reported that 7.24 fatal accidents occurred for every 100,000 workers and 4.77 accidents for every 1,000 workers in 2006," he said.

Last year's analysis showed a big decrease, recording only 4.84 fatal accidents per 100,000 workers. The rate of accidents per 1,000 workers went down to 2.81.

"We are aiming to hit only 2.81 fatalities per 100,000 workers by 2020," said Riot.

He added that competency among OSH officers played a major role towards achieving the target.

## 2 maut terhidu gas ammonia bocor

**SIPITANG** - Dua pekerja kontrak Petronas Chemicals Fertiliser Sabah Sdn. Bhd. (PCFSSB) maut selepas terhidu gas ammonia yang bocor dalam kejadian di loji Armonia dan Urea Sabah (Samur) di sini semalam.

Kejadian kira-kira pukul 9.30 pagi itu turut mengakibatkan tiga pekerja yang lain cedera, namun dilaporkan berada dalam keadaan stabil.

Difahamkan, salah seorang mangsa yang maut adalah warga tempatan manakala mangsa lain diperceyailah warga asing.

Petronas Chemicals Group Berhad dalam satu kenyataan mengesahkan mengenai kejadian itu yang berlaku di loji Samur.

Katanya, Pasukan Tindakan Kecemasan telah digerakkan ke lokasi kejadian dan keadaan adalah terkawal. "Insiden ini melibatkan lima pekerja PCFSSB dan syarikat memaklumkan dua daripadanya meninggal dunia.

"Tiga lagi pekerja lain yang turut terlibat telah diberikan rawatan,"

## Pelajar lelaki dikhuatiri terkena tumpahan merkuri

**SEREMBAN 25 Ogos** - Seorang pelajar lelaki dikhawatirkan ke klinik kesihatan selepas dikhuatiri terkena cecair merkuri ekoran sebihi termometer pecah di makmal Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan (SMK) Rantau, dekat sini hari ini. Dalam kejadian kira-kira pukul 11 pagi itu, lebih 20 pelajar tingkatan empat yang berada di dalam makmal itu dikuarantin selama satu jam oleh pihak Jabatan Bomba dan Penyelamat Negeri Sembilan bagi pemantauan tahap kesihatan mereka.

Ketua Pasukan Khas Unit Bahan Berbahaya (Hazmat) Negeri Sembilan, Mohamad Idris berkata, seramai 15 anggota dari Balai Bomba dan Penyelamat Sen-

awang dan Seremban bersama dua jentera dikhawatirkan ke klinik itu selepas menerima maklumat kejadian pada pukul 11.02 pagi.

Menurut beliau, pasukan yang disertai anggota Hazmat itu tiba di lokasi kejadian pada pukul 11.20 pagi dan mengambil masa selama kira-kira 24 minit untuk membersihkan tumpahan cecair merkuri.

"Seorang pelajar dikhawatirkan ke Klinik Kesihatan Rantau selepas dikhuatiri terjerjas dengan tumpahan merkuri setelah jarinya luka terkena serpihan termometer. Termometer itu pecah sewaktu pelajar tersebut sedang membuat uji kaji," katanya di sini hari ini.

## Wanita maut dihempap besi penyangkut kren

KUALA LUMPUR 25 Ogos - Seorang wanita, Chin Khooon Sing, 24, maut selepas kereta dipapunya dihempap besi penyangkut kren yang terjatuh di Jalan Raja Chulan, Bukit Bintang, di sini hari ini.

Ketua Polis Kuala Lumpur, Datuk Anwar Singh Isah Singh berkata, kejadian berlaku kira-kira pukul 11.30 malam dan mangsa maut di tempat kejadian.

Satu kenyataan di sini hari ini Semantara itu, jurua bomba dan penyelamat berkata pihaknya menerima panggilan mengenai kejadian tersebut kira-kira pukul 7.23 malam di kawasan pertama tiba 11 minit kemudian.

"Apabila tiba, kereta telah raman di bahagian dan tiba-tiba maut,"

## Elak kemalangan berulang, JKPP siasat menyeluruh

KUALA LUMPUR 26 Ogos - Jabatan Keselamatan dan Kesihatan Pekerjaan (JKKP) akan menjalankan siasatan secara menyeluruh terhadap kes kemalangan tragis besi penyangkut kren yang menghempap seorang wanita sehingga menyebabkan kematian di Jalan Raja Chulan, Bukit Bintang di sini semalam.

JKKP dalam satu kenyataan di sini hari ini memberitahu, notis pemberhentian kerja ke atas keseluruhan aktiviti pembinaan tersebut juga telah dikeluarkan terhadap pemuja projek hotel Harmoni Perkas Sdn. Bhd. di Jalan Raja Chulan itu bagi membantu siasatan.

"Setiap kren yang dipasang dan diselenggara oleh syarikat berkenaan haruslah berdaftar di bawah JKPP selaras dengan Akta Kilang dan Jentera (1967) dan kontraktor yang bertanggungjawab perlu memastikan pemeriksaan berkala dilaksanakan dari semasa ke semasa."

"JKKP amat memandang serius mengenai kejadian itu kerana kecuaihan mengutamakan faktor keselamatan di kawasan pembinaan milik kontraktor tersebut telah menyebabkan satu kematian yang tragis," katanya.

Dalam kejadian petang semalam, seorang wanita yang sedang memandu kereta maut apabila penyangkut besi kren terjatuh menghempap keretanya ketika mangsa melalui kawasan Royale Pavillion.

Dalam pada itu, ketua syarikat projek pembinaan terbit, BUCG (M) Sdn. Bhd. berkata, pihaknya amat kesal mengenai kejadian yang berlaku dan mengucapkan takliah kepada keluarga mangsa.

"Semua aktiviti pembinaan akan dihentikan sementara menunggu kejadian ini disiasat kerana pihak kami akan mengutamakan faktor keselamatan dan berharap kemalangan sebegini tidak menimpa mangsa yang lain," katanya.

Kemalangan yang melibatkan kren bukanlah perkara baru namun tindakan yang serius wajib dilakukan secepat mungkin dan berterusan untuk mengelak kejadian sama terus berulang."

Sementara itu, Pengerusi Institut Keselamatan dan Kesihatan Pekerjaan Kebangsaan (NIOSH), Tan Sri Lee Lam Thye berkata, beliau berasa amat sedih dan bimbang apabila menderang berita mengenai kemalangan tersebut kerana kejadian sedemikian dapat dielakkan sekiranya komitmen dan prosedur keselamatan ditutamakan.

"Kemalangan yang melibatkan kren bukanlah perkara baru namun tindakan yang serius wajib dilakukan secepat mungkin dan berterusan untuk mengelak kejadian sama terus berulang."

"Pihak yang didapati cuai ketika melakukan tugas sehingga ada nyawa menjadi korban perlu dihadapkan ke muka pengadilan sebagai pengajaran untuk semua pekerja agar lebih berhati-hati," katanya.

Jelasnya, slogan Keselamatan bukan satu keutamaan tetapi suatu keharusan yang sering beliau laungkan adalah sesuatu bertepatan dengan sektor pembinaan kerana pengalangan aspek berkenaan biasanya akan mengundng pelbagai kejadian buruk.

"Komitmen terhadap aspek keselamatan perlu bermula daripada pihak pengurusan tertinggi dan diterapkan serta dicontohi oleh pekerja di pelbagai peringkat," katanya.

## Kemalangan ke tempat kerja makin meningkat

**PUTRAJAYA 22 Ogos** - Jumlah kemalangan melibatkan perjalanan berulang-alik ke tempat kerja menunjukkan peningkatan yang membimbangkan iaitu 28,579 kes pada tahun lalu, peningkatan sebanyak 65.3 peratus berbanding 17,297 kes pada 10 tahun lepas.

Pengerusi Institut Keselamatan dan Kesihatan Pekerjaan Kebangsaan (NIOOSH), Tan Sri Lee Lam Thye berkata, dianggarkan kira-kira 77 peratus kemalangan jalan raya yang melibatkan pekerja adalah dalam kalangan penunggang motosikal.

"Kemalangan jalan raya melibatkan pekerja sangat serius dan membimbangkan. Sehubungan itu, NIOOSH telah melaksanakan pelbagai program dengan kerjasama pihak syarikat bagi memberi penerangan serta pendidikan mengenai pemanduan berhemah di jalan raya.

"Pada masa sama, NIOOSH turut mengadakan kerjasama dengan Jabatan Keselamatan Jalan Raya (JKJR) bagi membantu kita dalam melaksanakan program keselamatan jalan raya," katanya dalam sidang akhbar selepas majlis pelancaran Persidangan dan Pameran Keselamatan dan Kesihatan Pekerjaan (COSH) di Pusat Konvensyen Antarabangsa Putrajaya (PICC) di sini hari ini.

## Be more stringent on safety precautions, urges Lam Thye

**PETALING JAYA:** All construction crane operators must be certified competent by the Department of Occupational Safety and Health (DOSH), said Tan Sri Lee Lam Thye.

The National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health chairman said those companies operating cranes must also be registered with DOSH.

Commenting on Thursday's incident where a crane hook fell at a construction site and crushed a woman to death in her car, Lee said it was "totally unacceptable".

"There have been many such accidents in the past. The authorities must be very stringent in monitoring and enforcing laws and regulations under the Factories and Machinery Act," he said.

Fomca deputy president Mohd Yusof Abdul Rahman said construction companies should take precautionary measures, such as placing safety nets.

"Sometimes we can see big, heavy construction concrete blocks hanging over public areas. This can cause anxiety among pedestrians and motorists passing the area," he said.

He added that if areas near construction sites need to be closed off to traffic, it should be done to prevent an accident from happening.

Executive Joice Chin Khoo Sing, 24, was killed while on her way to a family dinner when the hook fell onto her car along Jalan Raja Chulan in Kuala Lumpur.

In January, a construction worker was killed when a crane collapsed at a site on Jalan Damansara.

A month later, another construction worker was killed by falling debris while installing a ceiling partition at a site in Kota Damansara.

## Gagal patuhi SOP: Wajar hukuman tegas

**PUTRAJAYA 27 Ogos** - Tindakan tegas termasuk langkah menyenarai hitam perlu dilakukan kepada kontraktor dan pengendali kren di tapak pembinaan yang gagal mematuhi prosedur operasi standard (SOP) sehingga menyebabkan kemalangan berlaku.

Pengerusi Institut Keselamatan dan Kesihatan Pekerjaan Negara (NIOOSH), Tan Sri Lee Lam Thye berkata, kejadian memabitkan seorang pengguna jalan raya maut kelmarin boleh dielakkan sekiranya kontraktor dan

pengendali kren memastikan jentera mereka dalam keadaan baik, selain menggunakannya dengan betul.

"Undang-undang yang diperuntukkan di bawah Akta Keselamatan dan Kesihatan Pekerjaan perlu diteliti oleh setiap pihak terutama mereka yang berada dalam industri pembinaan bagi memastikan keselamatan orang ramai.
