History of 28 April

The annual World Day for Safety and Health at Work on 28 April promotes the prevention of occupational accidents and diseases globally. It is an awareness-raising campaign intended to focus international attention on the magnitude of the problem and on how promoting and creating a safety and health culture can help reduce the number of work-related deaths and injuries.

The ILO celebrates the World Day for Safety and Health at Work on the 28 April to promote the prevention of occupational accidents and diseases globally. It is an awareness-raising campaign intended to focus international attention on emerging trends in the field of occupational safety and health and on the magnitude of work-related injuries, diseases and fatalities worldwide.

With the celebration of the World Day for Safety and Health at Work, the

ILO promotes the creation of a global preventative safety and health culture involving ILO constituents and all key stakeholders in this field. In many parts of the world, national authorities, trade unions, employers' organizations and safety and health practitioners organize activities to celebrate this date. We invite you to join us in celebrating this significant day and share with us the activities you organize.

The 28 April is also the International Commemoration Day for Dead and Injured Workers organized worldwide by the trade union movement since 1996. Its purpose is to honour the memory of victims of occupational accidents and diseases by organizing worldwide mobilizations and awareness campaigns on this date.

In 2003, the ILO became involved in the April 28 campaign upon request from the trade union movement. While we

honour injured and fallen workers, we appreciate and celebrate that these injuries and fatalities can be prevented and reduced, recognizing it as both a day for commemoration and celebration. Since 2003, the ILO observes the World Day on Safety and Health at Work on April 28 capitalizing on its traditional strengths of tripartism and social dialogue.

28 April is seen as a day to raise international awareness on occupational safety and health among trade unions, employers' organizations and government representatives alike. The ILO acknowledges the shared responsibility of key stakeholders and encourages them to promote a preventive safety and health culture to fulfill their obligations and responsibilities for preventing deaths, injuries and diseases in the workplace, allowing workers to return safely to their homes at the end of the working day.

OPTIMIZE THE COLLECTION AND USE OF OSH DATA

A contribution to the implementation of Sustainable Development Goal 8

The ILO's campaign for the 2017 World Day for Safety and Health at Work focuses on the critical need for countries to improve their capacity to collect and utilize reliable occupational safety and health (OSH) data.

The United Nations 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development adopted on September 25, 2015 encompasses a global plan of action with specific targets to end poverty, protect the planet, and ensure prosperity for all. With its adoption, the capacity to collect and utilize reliable OSH data has also become indispensable for countries to fulfil their commitment to implement and report on some of the agenda's 17 sustainable development goals and their targets.

Sustainable Development Goal 8, in particular, provides for the promotion of "inclusive and sustainable economic growth, full and productive employment and decent work for all" and its Target 8.8 focuses on the "protection of labour rights and promotion of safe and secure working environments for all workers, including migrant workers, in particular women migrants, and those in precarious employment." For Target 8.8 countries are asked to report on the following indicator: "Frequency rates of fatal and non-fatal occupational injuries, by sex and migrant status".

Multiple ILO OSH conventions also require ratifying member States to establish mechanisms to collect and utilize reliable OSH data for prevention purposes. These ILO instruments recognize that the collection and utilization of reliable OSH data are indispensable for the detection of new hazards and emerging risks, the identification of hazardous sectors, the development of preventive measures, as well as the implementation of policies, systems and programmes at international, national and enterprise levels. OSH data provide the basis for setting priorities and measuring progress.

To support member States in the improvement of their capacity to collect and utilize reliable OSH data, the ILO produced a Toolbox with relevant resources and a set of fact sheets

The ILO welcomes the opportunity to work with member States, social partners and other interested parties to face this OSH data challenge and meet their commitment on the implementation of the objectives of the 2030 Sustainable Development Agenda and their obligations under ILO conventions.

'Data helps keep workplaces safer'

Collection of statistics important to identify risks and hazards, says NIOSH executive director

COMPANIES should provide data on accidents and safety at the workplace to promote a safer working environment, said National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) executive director Zahirin Osman.

Under the United Nations (UN) 2030 Agenda, the collection of health and safety data was very important for each country as it was in line with the development of a country, he added.

He said many companies in Malaysia did not give NIOSH the necessary data, which disabled it from conducting research to improve safety and health at the workplace.

"It is not a requirement for companies to provide the data but we will advise it, so that we can focus on workers' rights and prepare a safe and healthy working environment," said Zahirin.

"The collection of data is very important to identify new risks and potential hazardous areas at the workplace," he said, adding that with the data, NIOSH would be able to take preventive measures including

implementing policies and programmes.

"Currently, we rely on Socio (Social Security Organisation Malaysia) and the Occupational Safety and Health Department (DOSHH) for accidents at the workplace."

"We hope this will change and more companies will approach us," Zahirin said after launching the World Day for Safety and Health at Work seminar at Menara NIOSH in Bangi.

He was joined by NIOSH Consultation, Research and Development Department general manager Fazilz Osman and NIOSH Education and Training Department and Regional Offices general manager Major (Rtd) Hanif Maidin.

Zahirin added that Socios statistics for 2015 showed 62,387 accidents were reported. These were classified as industrial accidents and when commuting between home and workplace.


"What is alarming is that accidents when returning home or going to the workplace

increased by 65.3% in 2015 compared to 2005.

"In the world, it is estimated that about two million people are killed in accidents or diseases at the workplace each year."

"DOSH statistics last year recorded 3,348 industrial accident cases that caused temporary disability with 114 cases causing permanent disability and 240 cases in death."

"The Government needs to work hard to ensure that our roads, transportation and work areas are safe for all," Zahirin said.

Jangan sembunyi kes kemalangan

JOHOR BAHRU 16 Mei - Golongan majikan diminta melaporkan semua kemalangan yang berlaku di tempat kerja dan tidak menyembunyikan perkara tersebut.

Pengerusi Institut Keselamatan dan Kesihatan Pekerjaan Negara (NIOSH), Tan Sri Lee Lam Thye berkata, majikan dalam pembinaan didapati sering berbuat demikian.

Beliau berkata, NIOSH dengan kerjasama beberapa universiti tempatan telah pun melakukan kajian berkaitan perkara tersebut bagi sektor pembinaan di seluruh negara ini.

"Antara 2009 hingga 2014, kajian tersebut mendapati sebanyak 31,347 kemalangan dilaporkan berlaku, namun hanya 787 kes yang disiasat Jabatan Keselamatan dan Kesihatan Pekerjaan (JKKP)."

Accidents at work being covered up

JOHOR BAHRU: There are still many employ- ers, mainly in the small and medium scale industries (SMIs), covering up accidents or "near-misses" at their workplaces.

National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (NOSEN) chairman Tan Sri Lee Lam Thye, who said this, added that a study done with two local universities found that only 20% of such accidents were reported to the Occupational Safety and Health Department (DOSH).

He said the study based on cases from 2009 to 2014, showed that 31,347 accidents occurred at workplaces nationwide with only 787 of them reported to DOSH.

"On average, the total number of accidents recorded at Socso is 10 times higher than the reports received by DOSH."

"There is a huge gap and this needs to be

addressed," he told reporters at the Johor World Occupational Safety and Health Day celebration here yesterday.

Lee said many cases which did not involve the loss of life went unreported as the employers were probably afraid of action from the authorities.

He also cited lack of awareness among employers as one reason why cases were being "hidden".

"Manufacturing and educational campuses usually reported the occurrences but the practice was still uncommon among SMIs."

He said manufacturing was the sector with the highest number of accidents, followed by construction and transportation.

Under the Employees' Social Security Act 1969, employers are given 48 hours to report workplace accidents to Socso.
